<p>Search newspapers in neighboring states for a death notice for Flossie—perhaps she was buried in a neighboring state??</p>	<p>"Colored Death Notices," listing for ██████, Nashville, Tennessee, 23 January ██████, page 22, column 1, digital image, <i>Newspapers</i> (https://www.newspapers.com : accessed 25 January ██████).</p>	<p>An obituary for Mrs. ██████ in Nashville, Tennessee newspaper mentioned a sister, "Mrs. Flossie ██████, Ky." Sarah was to be buried in the "family lot" in ██████ Cemetery." Could this be one of G. B. F. ██████ sisters? Another sister ██████ of ██████ is also mentioned. Perhaps Flossie's origin can be discovered through these ladies. Begin with ██████. This was the only mention of Flossie in the newspaper searches.</p>

Is Flossie with the family?</p>	<p>1900 U.S. census for ██████ County, Tennessee, population schedule, District ██████, no ward given, p. 155-B (clamped), enumeration district (ED) ██████, sheet 12-B, dwelling 224, family 224, ██████ household; digital</p>	<p>██████'s name is misnumbered as "LODDIE" this is why she didn't appear in searches for her in Tennessee in 1900! And ██████ was born in 18██ not 19██. So she was 63 when she died—</p>
